Several other consoles exchanged hands as well as an Atwater Kent breadboard, a Radiola V, some crystal sets, some small cathedrals, several other wooden Zenith table tops and consoles. Those interested in plastics had their choice of 2 Dahlberg pillow speaker radios, Crosley 11-104, and DT10N, Emersons, Motorolas, and a Radio Wave hair setting control which looked like a radio.

Transistor collectors were pleased with the novelties and typical shirt pocket radios. Knobs, tubes, parts, technical books and literature were also available along with a few speakers and a portable loop antenna.

The free appraisal session brought in items including a Bendix catalin, a Blatz beer can transistor and a 1912 J.J.Duck, Ferron Crystal Detector mounted on gray marble. A picture of a model of this crystal set can be found on page 128 of "Crystal Clear-Volume 1" by Sievers.

Several attendees enjoyed the "all-you-can-eat" buffet in the restaurant. It was a good meal and only \$9.00. ☐

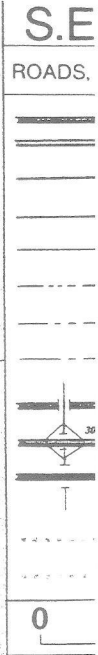
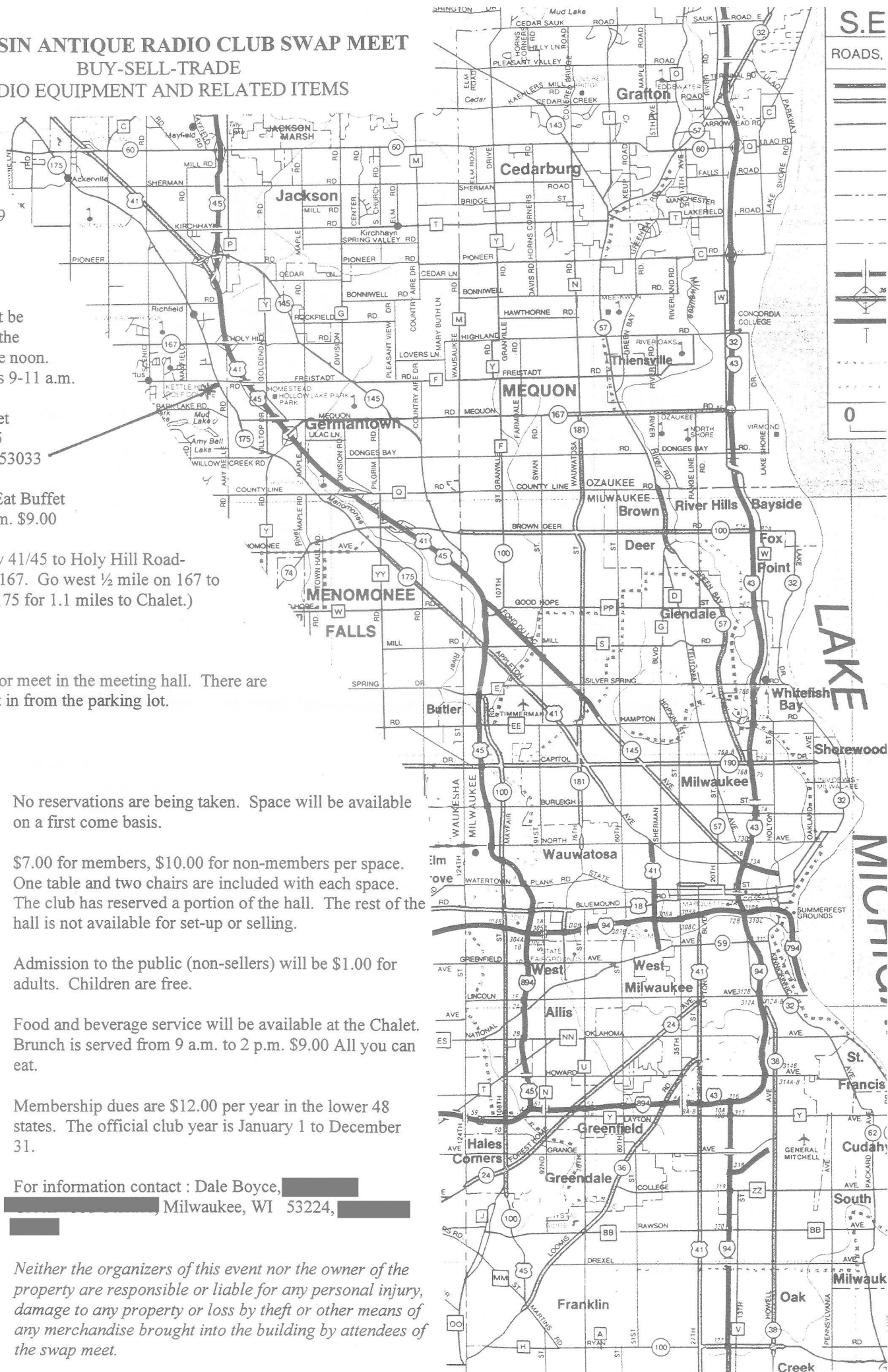
Admission: Admission to the public (non-sellers) will be \$1.00 for adults. Children are free.

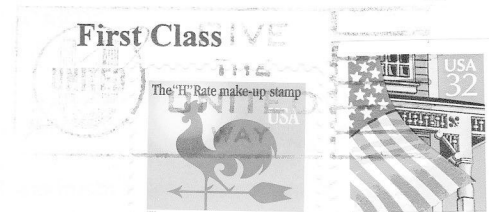
